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ITSA'S MAIN OBJECTIVES

- Advocate the use of excise tax stamps procured from independent, third-party providers, carrying multilevel security features and unique identifying codes, as tools for excise tax recovery, secure track and trace, product authentication, and compliance with international regulations such as the WHO FCTC Protocol to Eliminate Illicit Trade in Tobacco Products
- Conduct educational and information-sharing campaigns for revenue authorities and other stakeholders, on the subject of high-quality tax stamps and secure track and trace systems, using ISO 22382 (the 'tax stamp standard') as a foundation, with the aim to disseminate and promote best practices with regard to excise and supply chain control programmes worldwide

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
